

GPRRA Overview

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) awarded the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant to provide treatment and recovery services to individuals with opioid and stimulant use disorders. As part of this federal mandate, all SAMHSA grantees are required to collect and report performance data related to individual service by the SAMHSA grant. SAMHSA requires SOR Grantees to administer the GPRRA Client Outcome Measures Tool (GPRRA Survey) to fulfill this reporting requirement. The GPRRA Survey must be administered at multiple points during a client's recovery journey. All GPRRA surveys are inputted into PA WITS. GPRRA must be consented and referred to "T-Bucks SCA through PA WITS."

Introducing The GPRA Intake

Below is a sample intake script to help you introduce the GPRA Interviews to the individuals connecting to treatment and other recovery services:

“Your treatment and/or recovery support services are being funded by the State Opioid Response (SOR) grant. People receiving treatment or recovery support services for an opioid use disorder (OUD) or stimulant use disorder (SUD) through the SOR grant are required to participate in a series of interviews to help us learn more about what treatments are most helpful. The experiences that you share with us will be used to help improve the quality of treatment across the state. It will also allow us to comply with grant requirements and ensure that we continue to receive funding in the future to help others connect to treatment and recovery support services. Only you can tell us how your daily life has been impacted. Every voice matters and we want to ensure your voice is heard. Your feedback, insights and participation are valuable and greatly appreciated!

We ask you to participate in three interviews and they will each last between 25 or 35 minutes. The information shared during the interview is confidential and your personal information will be kept private. The first interview will be completed today at the start of treatment, another follow-up interview will be completed around 5 months after the start of treatment and another interview will be completed when your treatment ends. You will hear from BCDAC, Inc. Approval of Care department in about 5 months to complete the follow up interview. The interview can be completed over the phone for your convenience and will be scheduled around your availability. Please be sure to look out for phone calls, text messages or emails about completing the GPRA interviews.”

After you introduce the GPRA interviews, you will give the individual the **GPRA Client Flyer** and complete the Initial GPRA interview in PA WITS.
